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Who has access to your personal data (internally and externally)?	We ensure that only those departments that require access to your data in order to fulfill contractual and legal obligations are granted access. Depending on the purpose, this may include:
	 Internal departments: management, human resources, controlling, specialist departments, secretariat, vehicle fleet, IT, marketing.
	 External departments: parent company/subsidiaries and branches of the Mäder Group, affiliated companies, tax advisors, tax authorities, company pension providers, insurance brokers, educational institutions, insurance companies, personnel service providers, lawyers, auditors, banks, other external service providers.
	Your personal data will not be transferred to third countries outside the European Union or the European Economic Area. However, we will always ensure that appropriate measures are taken in accordance with all applicable laws to always protect any potential transfer of your personal data outside the European Union.
How long do we store your personal data for?	We store your data for at least the duration of the employment. Notwithstanding this, we store the data for different lengths of time depending on the legal retention periods and the fulfillment of collection purposes:
	labor record retention periods: 3 years – e.g. certificate of employment
	tax record retention periods: 6 years – e.g. vehicle logs, travel expense report, excemption certificate
	commercial record retention periods: 10 years – wage tax documents, annual accounts, payrolls
	pension insurance recor retention periods: 30 years
Would any disadvantages occur if you did not provide us with the data?	If you do not provide the required data – with the exception of consent – the employment relationship cannot be executed.



What rights do you have? Right of access Right of rectification Right of deletion Right of limited processing Right of data transmission	You have the right to request us to correct, delete or limit the use of your personal data if the legal requirements are met: • request information about which of your data we process (Art. 15 GDPR); • to have your data corrected or deleted, provided that this does not conflict with our legitimate interest or a legal obligation to process it (Art. 16, 17 GDPR); • to restrict the processing of your data (Art. 18 GDPR); • assert your right to data portability (Art. 20 GDPR). Note on revocation: If you have given your consent to certain processing activities (e.g. public relations or self-promotion), you can revoke this consent at any time with effect for the future. However, this revocation will not affect the previous processing of the data. Note on objection: If we process your data on the basis of legitimate interest (e.g. internal organizational and administrative purposes), you can also object to this processing at any time in accordance with Art. 21 GDPR, provided that the legal requirements are met.
